The Romantic North Canal Course

Otaru canal is a harbor facility constructed in 1923. It was built landfilling the coast and has been playing the important role to connect the workboats and the warehouses to exchange cargoes. The north section called "North Canal" has 40 meters width and there're still many workboats moored even today. While in the Temiya area, there's a railway heritage which contributed to the development of Otaru in the past. You can feel the old days of the city walking along it. Please enjoy taking a stroll around the areas and think of Otaru of the good old days when the city prospered as a Hokkaido gateway.

How to Reach the Course Starting Point

There are also a rest area, a bar, and a cafe.

MAP ① LeTAO Canal plaza shop

LeTAO Canal plaza shop is located on the corner where Chuodori Street, which runs straight from the station to the sea, and the Hokkaido Prefectural Otaru Rinkosen Street meet.

- Nearest Building : Hotel Nord Otaru, Otaru Museum (Annex)
- Nearest Station : Otaru Station (about 600m, 8-minute walk)

☆Access :

- ① Exit Otaru Station and take Chuodori Street towards the sea. Walk for 8 minutes.
- ② From Sakaimachidori Street where Kitaichi Glass is, walk about 7 minutes along the Otaru Canal and away from Sapporo.

Tourist Spot Information



MAP ① LeTAO Canal plaza shop

LeTAO is located in the Former OTARU WAREHOUSE, the oldest commercial warehouse in Hokkaido. There is also a rest area and a bar. Also there's the statue of Bunkou which was a mascot dog of the Otaru city fire department.

10-minute Walk



MAP ② Kitahama Bridge

A bridge known for the statue of "Girl calling the seagulls". You can see the classic scenery that many ships are moored in the side canal.

1-minute Walk



MAP ③ Former Shibusawa Warehouse

The warehouse on the right was built around 1892, and two more were added later. This warehouse is associated with Shibusawa Eiichi, who is on the 10,000 yen note. Currently a live house "GOLDSTONE" is open for business in it.

5-minute Walk



MAP ④ Canal Park

Park located in front of the Former Nippon Yusen K.K. Otaru Branch. There're statues of Isamu Hiroi and Choemon Ito who contributed to the development of Otaru port and the family featured in the nursery rhyme "Red Shoes".

2-minute Walk



MAP ⑤ Rinyu Morning Market

(4:00-14:00, Closed Sundays)
Opens at 4:00 which is the earliest open time in Otaru. A lot of fresh seafoods are on sale and the restaurant in the market are good for early breakfast.

8-minute Walk



MAP ⑥ Otaru Museum

(9:30-17:00, Close on Tuesdays or the next day when Tuesday is public holiday)
There's the starting point of the opening of Hokkaido railways. The Former Temiya Line in the museum is designated as an Important Cultural Property of Japan. Annex museum located next to the LeTAO Canal plaza shop is also good to learn the Otaru history.

15-minute Walk



MAP ⑦ Former Otaru Branch of Nippon Yusen Co.

(9:30-17:00, Close on Tuesdays or the next day when Tuesday is public holiday)
Designed by Shichijiro Satachi and built in 1906. This is one of the most famous stone made building in western style. It's designated as an Important Cultural Property of Japan.

7-minute Walk



MAP ⑧ Tanaka Shuzo Head Store

Their sake is made in the shop whose building was built in 1927. This is the only sake brewery in Otaru. (Local sake tasting is available)

About Japan Heritage

In Otaru City, the following cultural stories have been approved.

- Japan Heritage (日本遺産)**
- Merchant Ships Carrying Goods, Culture, and Big Dreams (Additional certification in 2018)**
Indicated by ◆ on the map.
- Powering Japan's Industrial Revolution (Approved in 2019)**
Indicated by ● on the map.
- Otaru, the City Called the "Heart" of Hokkaido: A Northern Mercantile City Revitalized by the Power of the People (Approved in 2025)**
Indicated by ♥ on the map.

Hokkaido's first railway line was opened in 1880, connecting Otaru/Temiya and Sapporo, and was used to transport coal and other materials. A walking path was constructed to preserve the original tracks after the railway line was discontinued in 1985. It takes about 25 minutes to walk from Sushiyadori Street to the Otaru Museum.
