Please put out household garbage in the designated garbage bags (provided fee) and with the designated

garbage disposal labels (provided fee) affixed as necessary.

Put out your Garbage by 8:30 a.m.

For recyclable garbage, the collection service is provided free of charge.

How to Put Out Garbage

Use of Designated Garbage Bags

Burnable waste --- Place in the designated yellow bags. Waste paper, paper, food scraps, disposable diapers, sanitary items, clothing, stuffed toys, small amounts of tree branches, fallen leaves, cigarette butts, etc.

Non-burnable waste --- Place in the designated blue bags. Bottles of cosmetics, oil cans, paint cans, small-sized electrical appliances, pots, kettles, frying pans, wash bowls, buckets, glass, ceramics, stationary, toys, video tapes, cassette tapes, metal products, etc.

Use of Garbage Disposal Labels

These labels should be affixed directly to non-bulky garbage that does not fit in the designated garbage bags (bulky garbage: 1 m or more on the longest side or diameter, 50 kg or more in weight or 0.1 m³ or greater in volume).
